Message from our Head Girl and Boy

Class News

Class 1 and 2

We had a mysterious visitor in school this week who had mistakenly been left behind when the aliens who love underpants, landed in our yard! (Apparently, he enjoyed his holiday in our school so much he sent us some photographs of what he got up to!) The children were very excited to explore the crash site, looking for clues as to what had happened and then they received a letter explaining and asking them for help in reuniting the alien with his friends. The children obliged by writing posters to identify the missing alien, maps to help him find his way home and creating their own space adventures.



Due to the children's ongoing interest in our Space theme, we will continue next week but with a focus on vehicles. We will be writing information books next week so the children understand the difference between fiction and non-fiction. During our mathematics this week, we have concentrated on making sure the children understand the value of each digit. For example, 12 cannot be 21 because the digits are tens and ones so cannot be reversed. We have also been counting on and back to solve simple addition and subtraction problems. Next week, we will explore doubling and halving.

Thank you for all your support for World Book Day. The children have been very engaged in talking about their favourite books, why they like them and their favourite characters. It is fantastic to hear all the story telling language and to witness the children's obvious, emerging life-long love of reading.

Class 3, 4 and 5

Following our snowy start to the term, we spent the first week describing the wintery conditions using our senses and similes. After this, the children independently wrote their 'No-More-Marking' activity, which was based around a snow-covered scene.

This year's World Book day was fantastic; we have been bowled over by the efforts made by the children to decorate their potatoes. The children came to school incredibly enthused and inspired by their characters and have written some exciting comic strips and stories.



In science, we have been investigating and testing a range of materials and objects to see whether they can be manipulated by being twisted, bent, squashed or stretched.

In preparation for our trip next week, in our topic lessons we have been studying pictures of a Victorian classroom and have been comparing them to classrooms today. The children have been discussing the similarities and differences and came up with questions that they would like to find out about the pictures.



Reminders/ notices

Before the half-term holiday every child in Key Stage 1 will have come home with their class Dojo login details. Over this term we will be using this platform to share the work and learning that we have been doing in school. Children will be able to send home pictures of their work.

We are looking forward to our trip on Wednesday- thank you to all the parents and grandparents who have kindly offered to come along and support us- without volunteer support the trips would not be able to go ahead. On the day, the children should arrive at normal time, they should be wearing their school uniform but may wish to wear trainers for the day. Our kitchen staff will be kindly preparing a packed lunch (including a drink and fruit snack) for the day but you child may still wish to bring a water bottle.

<u>Class 6, 7 and 8</u>

We hope everyone is refreshed after half term. It's lovely to have all the children back and to be able to enjoy the lighter days.

The children are enjoying learning about volcanoes as part of our topic. Please could you remind your child to bring in a small water bottle, e.g. fruit shoot size, to be used as part of their volcano structure that they will begin building next week.

The children completed some excellent descriptive writing this week about what they might find in the centre of the Earth. They enjoyed using their senses to describe what their character may be experiencing in their story.





In science, we are beginning to investigate rocks, soil and fossils. Please encourage your children to bring in any fossils or special rocks they may have to show and talk about with the class.

The children and adults are really enjoying working with Mrs Sellers in PE. It's such a treat to work and be taught with a professional dancer!



We were amazed at the wonderful entries brought in for our 'Dress the Potato' competition. Some very creative entries! Well done year 3 and 4!

<u>Class 9/10/11</u>

After a snowy beginning, the children in years 5 and 6 have made a really positive start to the new half term. We are delighted to welcome Mr Mark Jobling (from the Yorkshire Cricket Club) into school on Wednesday afternoons. Mr Jobling is delivering exciting and challenging cricket-themed skills and games; the children have thoroughly enjoyed the sessions so far and are already improving their cricketing skills! The children should make sure that they have a suitable (warm) outdoor PE kit in school on Wednesday afternoons so that they can take part in these sessions.





As we are supporting Fairtrade Fortnight, much of our work has been centred around investigating and researching Fairtrade. In English, the children have written in role as cocoa bean producers in the Fairtrade co-operative of Ngoleagorbu. They have worked hard to promote the Fairtrade movement and shared their stories with younger children in the school.

This week, Class 10 shared their learning with parents, grandparents and family members, entertaining us with their amazing story writing, poetry, pop art-style paintings and music compositions. Thank you Class 10!
