What is it made of and why?

Art/D&T

- Use a range of materials creatively to design and make products
- Know how to cut, roll and coil materials
- Know how to use IT to create a picture
- Know how to create a printed piece of art by pressing, rolling and stamping
- Know how to make a clay pot and know how to join two pots together
- Know how to use different effects within an IT paint package

Music

- Use instruments to perform and choose sounds to represent different things
- Play simple rhythmic patterns on an instrument

History

- Know that the toys their grandparents played with are different to their own
- Organise a number of artefacts by age
- Know what a number of older objects were used for
- Know the main difference between their school days and those of their grandparents

Science – everyday materials

- Know the name of the materials an object is made from
- Know about the properties of everyday materials
